

*N.T. Wright: 15 Essential Biblical Texts* – N.T. Wright, 2021. (15 sessions)

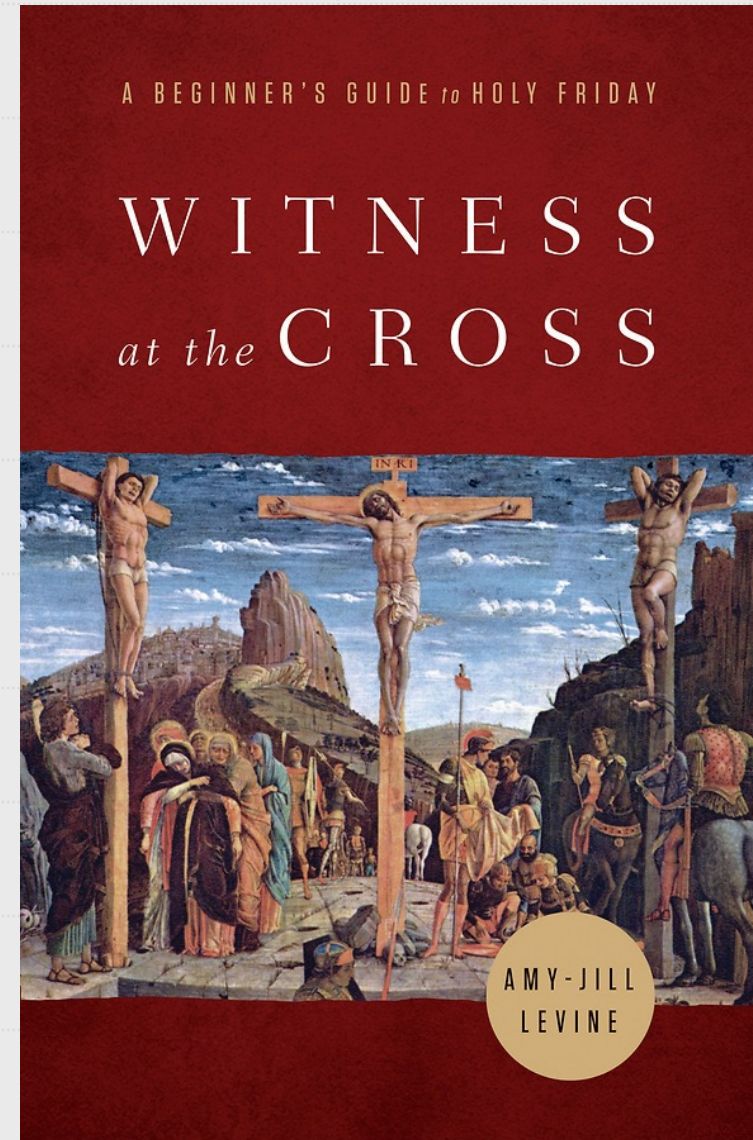

# *The Bible in 30 Seconds or Less* – 2020 (>100 short videos)

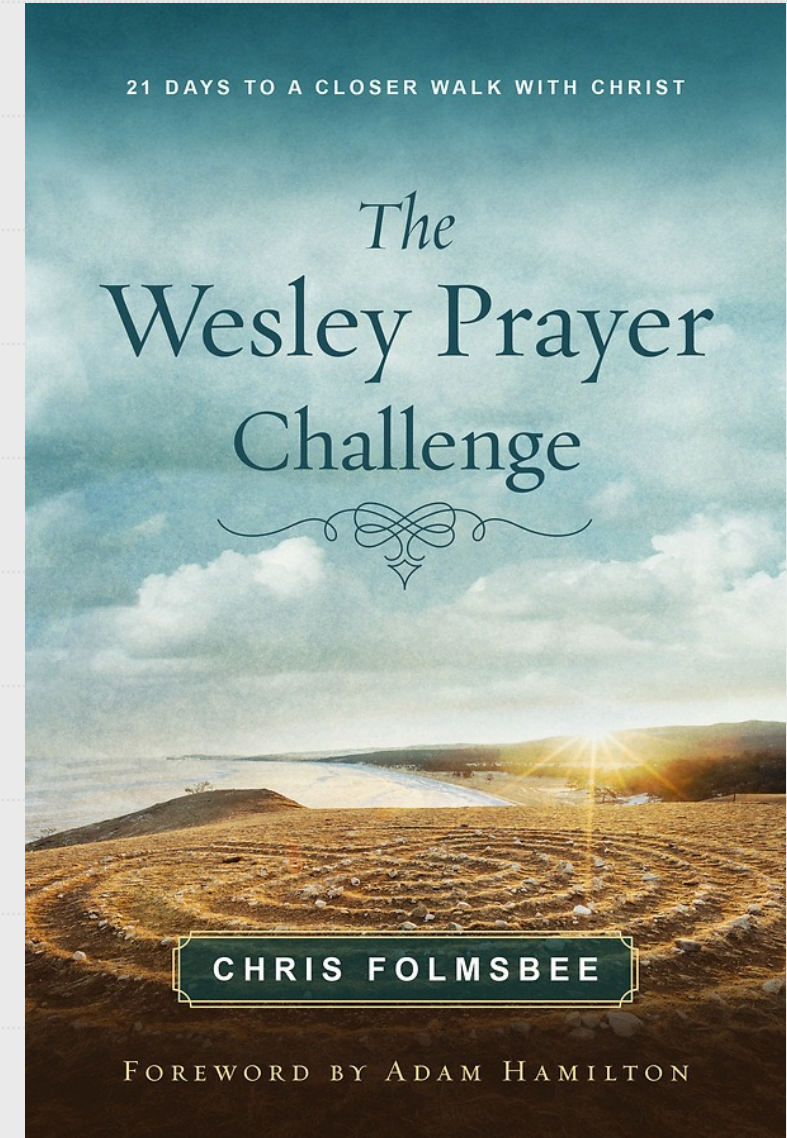

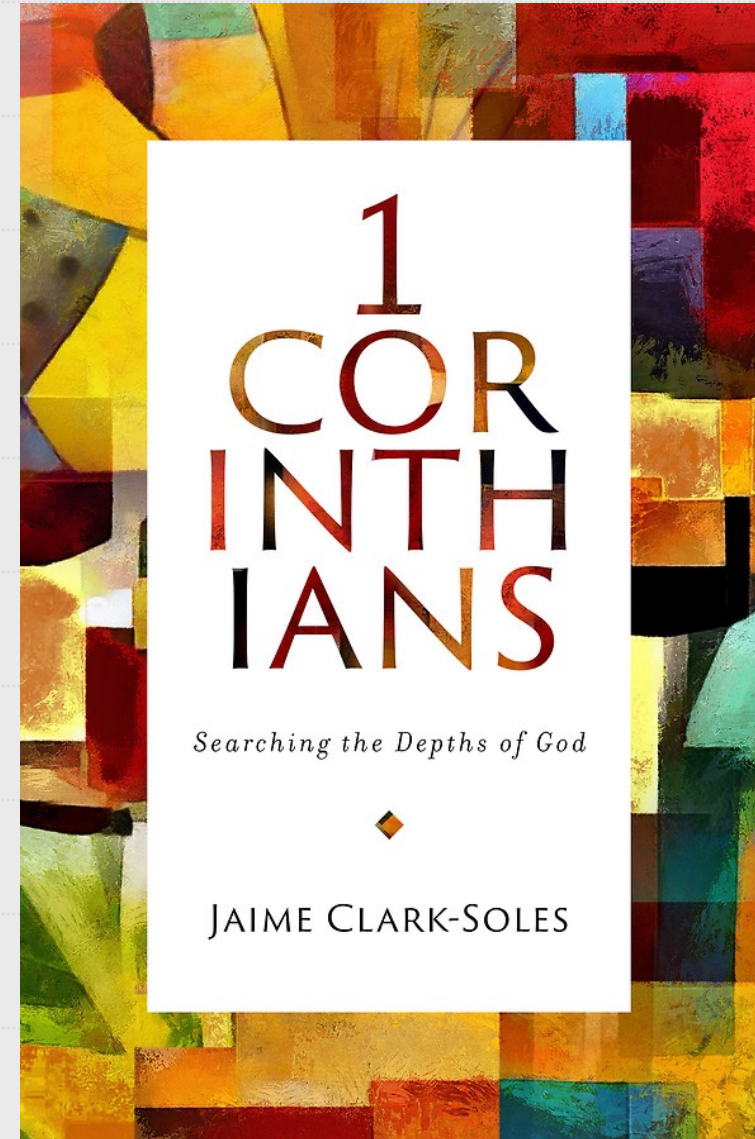

Wesley expected that people would pray this prayer as a way of remembering, renewing, and surrendering themselves in complete trust to God. In *The Wesley Prayer Challenge*, author Chris Folmsbee invites the readers to consider the words from the Wesley Covenant Prayer for three weeks, while reflecting on their meaning in the context of the larger piece.

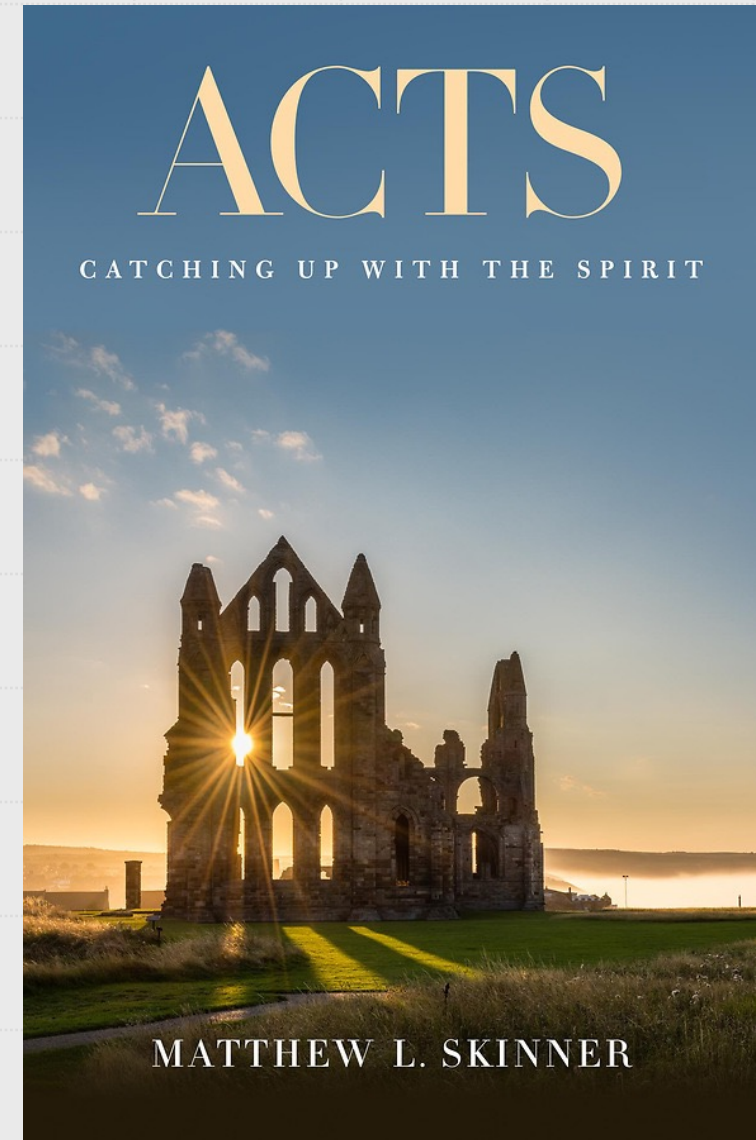




*Acts: Catching Up with the Spirit* – Matthew L. Skinner, 2020 (6 sessions)

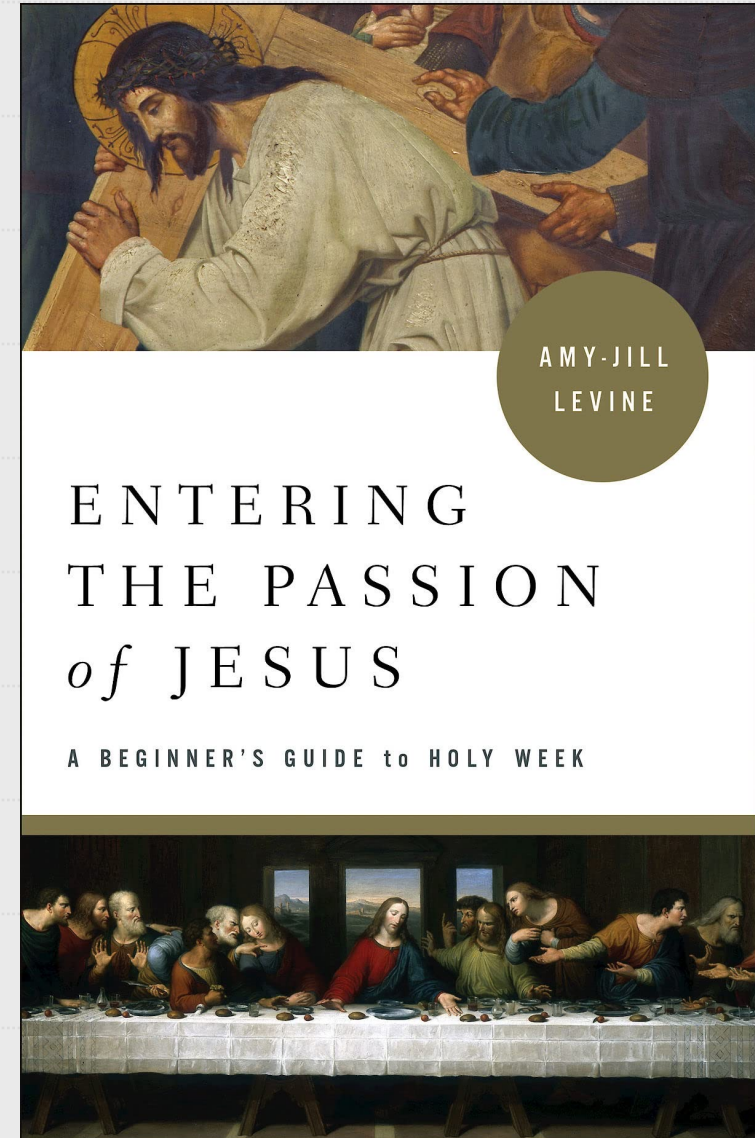

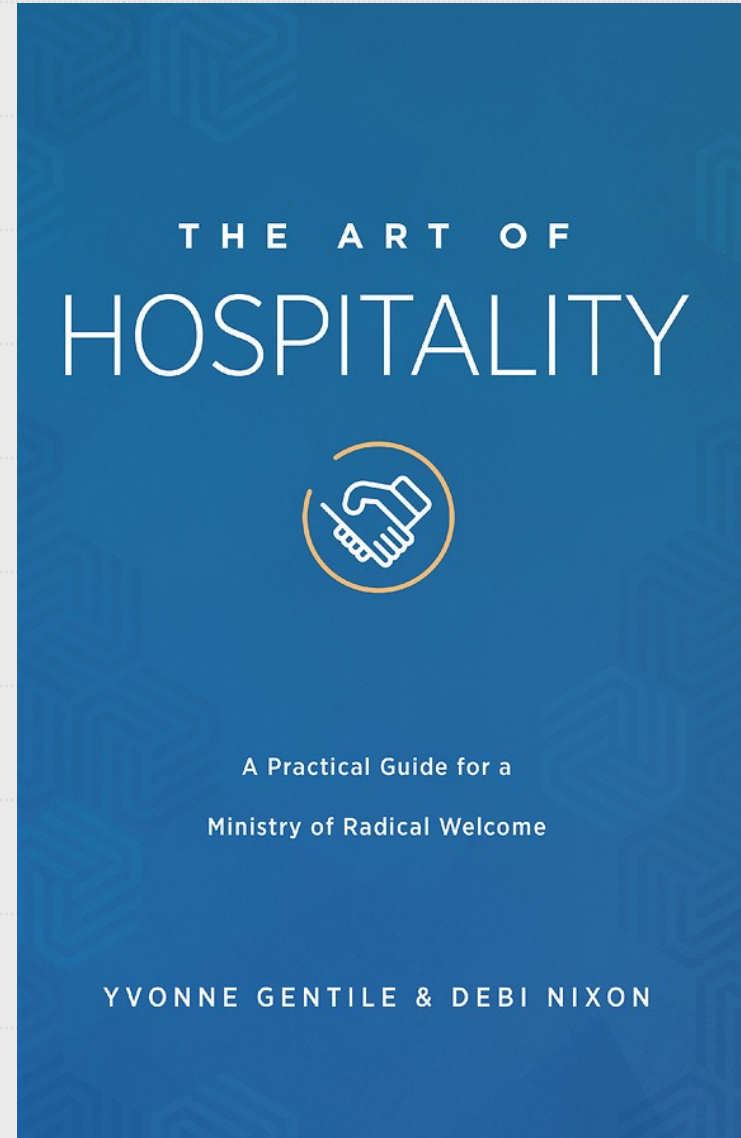

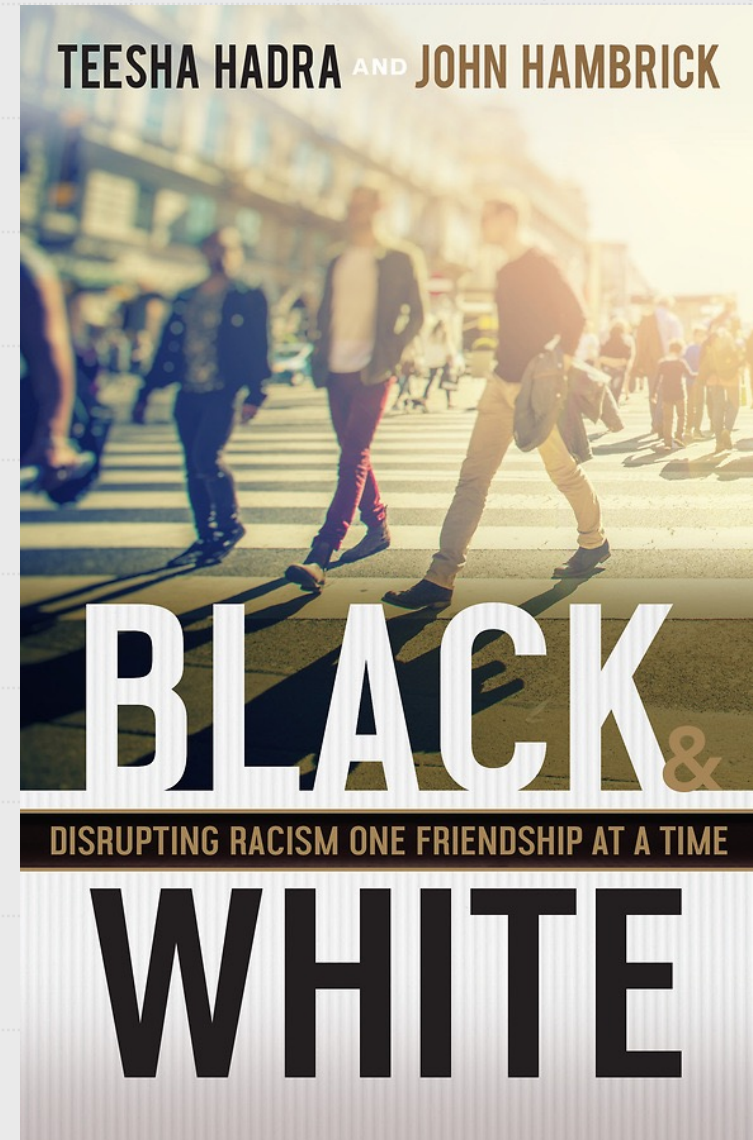




*Black & White: Disrupting Racism One Friendship At A Time* – Teesha Hadra and John Hambrick, 2019 (3 sessions)

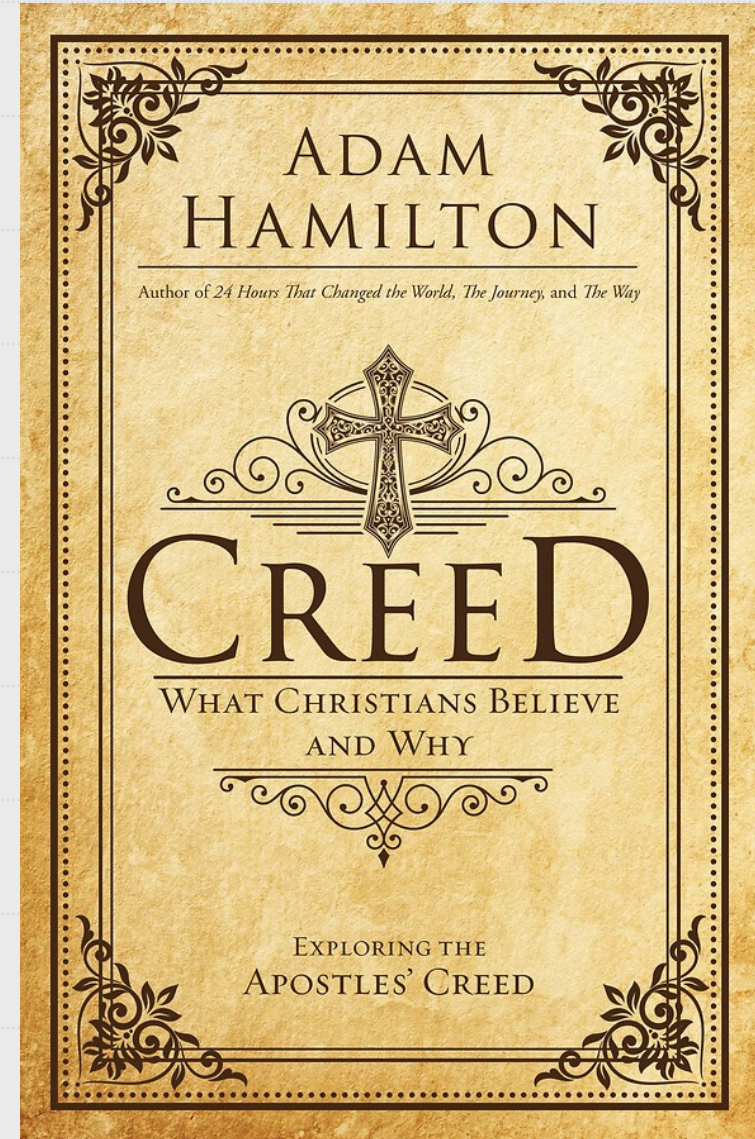

## *Faithful and Inclusive* – Rob Fuquay, 2019 (6 sessions)

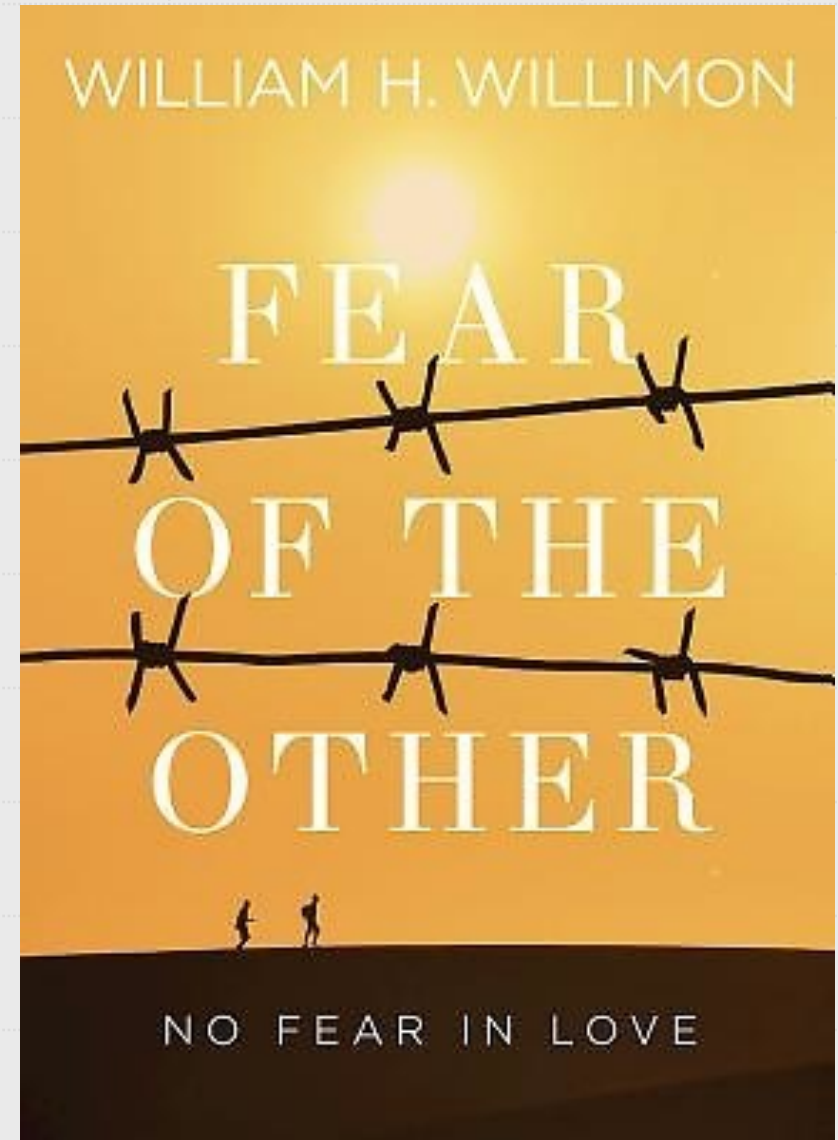

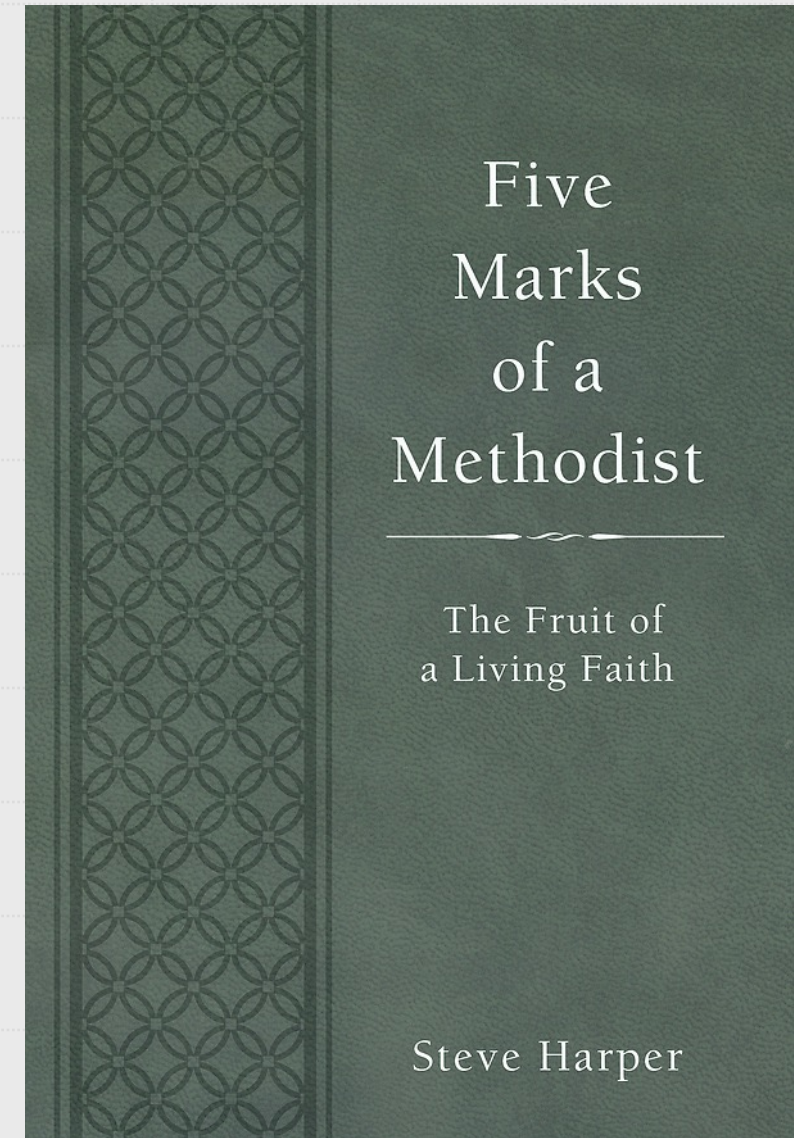
